

Foreign Demand Not Quite So Strong

Montreal Notes Falling Off in Call for Old and New Crop Spring Wheat.

MONTREAL, Sept. 6.—The foreign demand for old and new crop Manitoba spring wheat was quieter and closing prices bid were 1/2 to 5/8 per quarter lower than yesterday. Considerable business is being worked over the cable in American corn and hard winter wheat, consequently the demand for local grain is advancing. Owing to a further advance of 1/2 per bushel in prices for wheat, Winnipeg the market here was much stronger and 1/2 per bushel higher with "good demand." The foreign demand for wheat in bulk and prices equivalent to \$4.50 per ton here were bid for round lots and some sales were made for future shipment. A good business continues to be done in flour for local and export account. The market for dressed eggs is 2/6 per owt. higher. An active trade is passing in eggs. Cheese and butter are quiet.

Record Shipment Of Eastern Cattle

Biggest Day of the Year in Montreal Stock Yard—Prices Go Lower.

MONTREAL, Sept. 6.—A record shipment of eastern cattle, together with sixteen cars of northwest cattle, consigned to Mr. G. B. Loefer, made the receipts of the East End Stock Yard the largest of the year. There was a better grade of cattle on offer, but with few buyers present, cattle prices dropped from 10 to 50 per cent. Receipts of cattle, 1800, consisted of 1000 head of mixed northwest sold by Mr. Louis Delorme brought \$5.50 and a few steers at \$6. Eastern steers, choice, \$5; good, \$4.50; medium, \$4; poor, \$3.50; grass bulls, for canning, \$3 to \$3.50; cows, best butchers, \$4.50 to \$4.75; good, \$3.25 to \$4.00; poor to medium, \$2.50 to \$3; calves, \$2.50 to \$3. There was a small run of milkers on offer, with only a few buyers, and the sales which were made were chiefly to Mr. Cardinal from Quebec, who bought white carload for shipment to Quebec customers, for some of which he paid the full carrying price. Eight at \$2.50 and 6 at \$2 each. Receipts of sheep estimated at 1200. Old sheep, easy, at \$5 to \$5.50; bucks and culls, \$2.50 to \$3. Receipts of hogs estimated at 2000. Market fairly active at easier prices. Select hogs, \$7.50 to \$7.75; heavy fats, \$6; sows, \$5.50; and stags, \$4 per cwt., weighed off the cars. Receipts of calves estimated at 300; market steady; prices, \$3 to \$4.
