Hon. Walter Long Says Mother Country Has Been Slow to Make Her Wants Known, With the Result That Canada Has Gone to Her Aid.

"Altho the mother country has wanted assistance, she has been slow to make her wants known, with the result that Canada has come to her saying: "You are behind the times. You need our assistance; therefore we offer our cash. Later on we hope to be able to tender some advice, and subsequently taking part in the administration of affairs." Thus spoke the Right Hon. Walter H. Long, M.P., secretary for Ireland in the British Cabinet, at the National Club Thursday night. He dwelt upon the political situation in Canada and its effect upon the political field of Great Britain. How the fight waged during the general election of last fall had changed the political aspirations of those who sit in the front benches of the imperial parliament. He also lauded the tendency of Canada to contribute towards the British navy rather than construct naval armaments of her own.

Denison, who said to me when in England last, that the people of Canada are loyal to the British Crown and to the empire. I have come to realize that you understand our position at home.
