RIGHT HON. HUGH C. E. CHILDERS CROSS IN THE BAR.

Sketch Showing the Different Posts Held by Childers in the Service of His Country. President Kruger Warns Miners Against Committing Any Branch of the Peace Other Cablesgram.

London, Jan. 29.—The Right Hon. Hugh C. E. Childers, ex-member of Parliament and the occupant of several offices in former Liberal Cabinets, died at 6 o'clock this afternoon.

Hugh Callender Jardley Childers, P.C., F.R.S., only son of the late Rev. Eardley Childers of Cantley, county of York, was born June 18, 1852, educated at Cheam school and at Trinity College, Cambridge, was made B.A. in 1874, and M.A. in 1875. He was married in 1880 Emily (who died in 1875) daughter of Mr. George L. A. Walker of Norton, Worcester. He afterwards married Katharine Ann, daughter of the late Right Rev. Dr. Gilbert, Bishop of Chester, and an widow of the late Hon. Gilbert Elliott, son of the second Earl of Minto; was a member of the Government of Victoria, Australia, 1881-7, and a member of the Cabinet, 1887-90, as Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and represented Portlaoine in the first Legislative Assembly, 1889-7. He was a junior Lord of the Admiralty, 1884-6, Financial Secretary to the Treasury, 1889-4, Financial Secretary to the Admiralty, Dec. 1888, to March, 1871, Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, with a seat in the Cabinet, from Dec. 1871, to Dec. 1882, and Chancellor of the Exchequer, Dec. 1882, to Dec. 1885, was afterwards Secretary of State for the Home Department. He was an Independent Liberal member of the House of Commons, 1885, to 1890, and was Secretary of the Division of Edinburgh from Jan. 9, 1890, to his death. He was a Captain, which founded in the Baltic Sea some years ago.
