Loudon Markets Steady.

New York April 28.—The Evening Post's financial cable from London says: The stock markets here were steady to-day (except in one spot noted later) on the Bank of England return and the further Inflow of gold. The main feature was a further rise in Brazil and Argentine stocks. Americans were neglected here but were supported at the close by New York, apparently on the bombardment incident. The Kiondike group was especially strong. Union Pachac preferred was bid for on dividend rumors. The further rise in silver and the increased activity were due to America withholding supplies and the announcment of a French mintage order for 500,000 to be tendered for on Saturday. Some persons say the order is really for Spain. The Bank of Spain's geturn shows the effects of the recent run, by a decrease of £1,500,000 in the silver reserve. The minimum legal proportion of the bullon to notes required by the Bank of Spain is 33 per cent. The present figure is 37 per cent. Spanish exchange is selling at 45 pesetas to the pound sterling, the lowest rate on record. Two weeks ago the rate was 47%. The details of the gold movement for the week are: £912,000 of from Denmark and 15,000 from Australla. Sixty-nine thousand pounds in American coin were sold. I learn that in addition to the expected receipts of gold cabled yesterday three-quarters of a midlion are due from Egypt next week. The coin and bullion in the Bank of England has increased this week £1.511,000, partly due from Egypt next week. A more cheerful sentiment was produced by the reports of the destruction of the Spanish fortifications at Matanzas, the expectation of a decisive victory at the Phalippines and the cordial assurances exchanged yesterday between Secretary Gage and the leading New York bankers. The absence of change in monetary conditions completed the influences favorable to better values. Sugar refining advanced nearly 2 per cent. on advices of improved trade conditions and prospects. Gains of 1 per cent. or over were recorded by the Grangers, the excellent March statement of the Burlington & Quancy Road being encouraging to traders. 
