

tem will be abolished, and the aldermen will be elected, one half by each of the two divisions into which the city will be divided. It is proposed that a new method of balloting should be used in connection with the proposed new conditions of selecting the aldermen. Under the existing system, which is known as multiple or block vot-ing, each elector has as many votes as there are aldermen to be elected. The defect of this system is that it leads to a monopoly of representation. Take as an illustration a city in which nine thousand voters go to the poils to elect nine aldermen. If five thousand voters unite on a ticket of mine ndidates, they can elect the whole coun cil and the other four thousand voters will not be able to elect anybody. Each of these five thousand voters has nine votes, and this enables them to place their nine candidates at the top of the poil, by giving each candidate about 5000 votes. The re-maining four thousand electors may unite on another ticket if they like, but they are powerless.

If we suppose a case where three tickets are in the field it is quite possible for 4000 voters to elect a full complement of alder-men, leaving the other 5000 voters completely unrepresented. In this case a ma-jority of the electors would have no repre-sentation. If we adopt the proposed system of electing our aldermen it would seem to be only right that the principle of proportional representation should be substituted for the existing method. An idea of how the new system would work out may be gained from an examination of the Hare-Spence system, which is one of

The Altre-spence system, which are volume in the propertional representa-tion. Suppose that Smith, Brown, Jones and Robinson are running for a city mayoratiy. Under the improved system, each voter marks his ballot for all the candidates in the order, of his chice, with the fagues 1, 2, 3, 4. For instance, take a voter who wants Smith to be elected and who thinks Robinson the most objectionalle of . the candidates, and who prefers Brown to Jones. That voter will mark his ballot, thus: "Brown, 2; Jones, 5; Robinson, 4; Smith, 1." 
