NON-POLITICAL MANAGEMENT OF STATE-OWNED RAILWAYS.

GRAND TRUNK RAILWAY THE JAPANESE AT VANANOW

Northwanch, June 20.—A Russian officer who was wounded in the battle of Vananow (Telissu) told an Associated Press correspondent that the losses on both sides were severe. He placed the Russian casualties at at least 7000. He says no soldiers in the world could withstand the Japanese as they have been fighting lately.

Their artillery fire, he claims, is marvellously effective. The Russians fought stubbornly, but they were unable to withstand the enemy's dashing persistence. Several hundred wounded Russians have been sent north, owing to a lack of hospitals and surgeons. All the available transportation has to be used for supplies and for the evacuation of the sick and wounded. The Japanese buried most of the Russian dead after the battle.

It is estimated on information obtainable that the Japanese force moving northward is 70,000 strong, with 30,000 men in the aggregate engaged in the operations at Port Arthur. Several Japanese spies have recently been captured a few miles south of Newchwang.

OKU'S MARCH ON PORT ARTHUR. Route Described by a St. Petersburg Correspondent.

The "Rusky Viedomosti," the Exchange Telegraph Company's St. Petersburg correspondent says, gives the following interesting details on obstacles which General Oku will probably encounter before he reaches Port Arthur. On the day following the battle of Kichan, General Oku's army occupied the junction of the railway between Port Arthur, Dalny and Tallyen.

The Japanese army can advance on Port Arthur by two roads from this point: a shorter route by the sea, and a southern railway line to Inchenhai, altogether a distance of twenty miles from the first point to Dalny and then west along the railway. The latter route is the more difficult, as, instead of following the high ground of the railway, the Japanese will be obliged, after leaving Dalny, to take a broad turn through the narrow defile of the mountains.

Probably the Japanese will now, as they did in the past, take the shorter route, but at least two very difficult heights, the first of which is the Russian check-point at the advance of the Japanese is the Andeshan Range, which stretches like a bow, and the second is the mountain of the Peninsula, which stretches like a bow.

The highest points of this range are 1200 feet, with an average altitude of 1200 feet. The range is very steeply on both sides to the sea, and it is a narrow passage at the sea shore. From the Andeshan Range, the Japanese will be obliged to descend to the sea shore, which is a very difficult task.
