

BY BUTWELL'S GOOD RIDE NIMBUS LANDS FEATURE

Wins Woodmere Selling Stakes at
Aqueduct by a Length,
Going Away.

AQUEDUCT, Nov. 4.—Nimbus, backed down from even money to 7 to 10, won the Woodmere Selling Stakes to-day. His victory was due in a large measure to the good ride of Butwell, who allowed Nimbus to drop behind the early pace to win inside the last furlong pole, when he moved up fast and won going away by half a length. Spouting Notes.
The cross country race of four miles
for G.C.I. students at Galt on the 18th

Will Fight Injunction
The Toronto Printing Press Asso-

ances at the hands of some of the in-
ternational unions, be it resolved that
the executive committee be authoriz-
ed to open negotiations with the Cana-
dian Federation of Labor and to en-
ter into articles of affiliation with the
said federation."

half of the union were characterized as
untrue. The union will fight the ac-
tion that has been brought against
them concerning the adoption of a
union label.
