

PACER GOES IN RECORD TIME AT HILLCREST
Tredell in Unfinished Race, Driven by Nat Ray—Grand Opera Wins Free-for-All.

HILLCREST PARK, Jan. 1.—New Year's brought out the largest attendance of ice racing fans to Hillcrest Park Saturday afternoon than any previous day since the winter season opened. There were 1000 in the ring and on the stand when the going rang for the start of the first heat. The track was firm and record time was made in several of the heats.

The 2:11 pace left over from Friday was decided when the local pacer Tredell, driven by Nat Ray carried the race off by winning three straight heats. Ed Dier set the pace till within 50 feet of the ring, where he hung and Tredell nipped him by an eyelash. The time of the heat, 2:13 1/2, is the fastest ever paced over the ice at this track and now stands as the track record.

The five shifty trotters lined up in the free-for-all trot. Gordon Prince, Jr., was an added starter. In the 2:20 pace Dan Bingen, Malden Voyage and Dan Forrester were withdrawn. Fatchen Whites was an added starter.

In winning the first heat of the free-for-all trot, Grand Opera established a world's record for a mile heat over a half-mile ice track. Grand Opera won the mile in 2:12 1/2, a second and a quarter faster than the record of 2:13 1/2, made by Gratton Royal in January, 1915.

Grand Opera ran in behind the Grand Circuit winner, Yedro, for the first half, then went to the front and easily withstood the final bid of Texas Jim. Texas Jim closed fast and easily took the place from the liring Yedro.

Fred Hal in the first heat of the 2:20 pace went to the front and lead his field the entire race. Golden Rex finished well under a drive and beat Buster James a length for the place.
