

HEMISPHERE PAYS \$312.70 FOR \$2. PLACE, AT CONNAUGHT PARK

HEMISPHERE LOOKED LIKE WINNER UNTIL

Gala Dress Came Thru on the Stretch and Won by Half Length.

Ottawa, June 22.—The largest mutual prize since the resumption of horse racing in Canada was paid at Connaught Park this afternoon when H. Warner's Hemisphere paid second to Seagram's Gala Dress in the Canadian-bred event, and paid \$312.70 for a \$2 ticket. There were only eight tickets out on Hemisphere, which did not appear to have a chance, but the Warner colt set the early pace and looked like a winner until Gala Dress came thru on the stretch and won by half length. Hemisphere paid \$312.70 for place and \$58.30 to show. Four of the place tickets were held by ladies on the members' lawn, while one man held Hemisphere across the board.

Rains in the morning slowed the track up to some extent, but another great crowd turned out and the program was keenly contested, with good fields in each of the events.

An aftermath of yesterday's racing came today in the disqualification of Little Boy, which led to the wire in the fourth race Monday. The cause of the disqualification as announced by Stewards Francis Nelson and Herman P. Conklin, was a question of ownership. The horse was run in interest of E. S. Moore and saddled by Staff Doyle. Following the race there were rumors of a rider having been run. Inquiries brought out contradictory statements from those involved and finally it was admitted that the horse did not belong to E. S. Moore. Further inquiry will be made to establish the ownership and identity of the animal.

By the disqualification, Allah is declared the winner. Elmont moves up into second place, and Huzzas, which also ran, falls into third position. Summary:

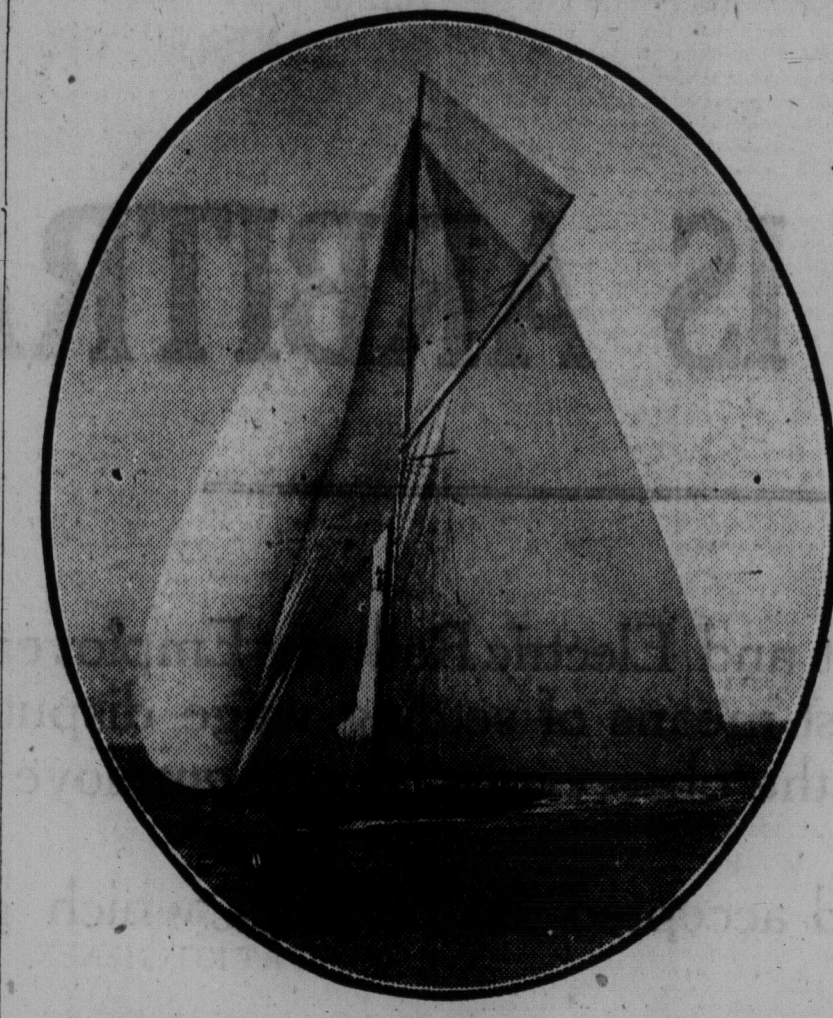
