**BLACK DIAMOND MINE OPENED**

The Maritime Coal Railway and Power Co. have taken action with regard to the Black Diamond Mine near Macdon Station. The general manager of the company, R. J. Bell, will have supervision over this colliery and John D. Rette has been appointed local manager. The mine will be fully equipped with electric coal diggers and with equipment run by electric power furnished from an output of about two hundred and fifty tons of coal per day. The work of pumping the water from this mine is now under way and active coal operations will be begun at a very early date.

**HAMPTON MAN DIES OF WOUNDS**

Death of Sergt. Major Adams Reported—Captain Worden Out of Danger—Private David Mar, Brussels Street, Wounded

Company Sergeant Major Arthur Adams, 18th Battalion, died on April 30 as a result of wounds received in battle. His mother, Mrs. James Adams of Hampton, who had been advised on Sunday that he had been wounded, received the news of his death yesterday. He is survived by his father, James Adams, navigating officer of the cable steamer Minion, his mother and one brother, James, in Hampton, and two sisters, Miss Elizabeth of the St. John schools staff and Miss Marguerite, now attending Normal school. At the time he died Sergeant Ford was acting as instructor in the military school in Fredericton.

Captain John W. Worden, 7th Battalion, formerly of Bayswater, wounded at Ypres, is now out of danger.

Major McNaughton, reported wounded, is a nephew of P. W. McNaughton of Sackville.

The last casualty list included among those wounded, the names of the following maritime provinces soldiers: Private John David Morris, 72 Brussels street, St. John, N. B.; Private John Alexander Beaton, Brookfield, P. E. I.; Amner Corporal Ambrose Cogswell, Wellington, P. E. I.
