

## YORK-SUNBURY NAMES HAWKINS

Frederickton Lawyer to Oppose R. B. Hanson for Liberals

Choice is Unanimous — Fine Weather Keeps Farmers at Home.

FREDERICKTON, Oct. 14.—The Liberal convention for the counties of York and Sunbury here today nominated C. Robert Hawkins, barrister, of Frederickton, as a candidate in the interest of the Government of Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King. Mr. Hawkins, after his name was presented to the convention by a nominating committee, which considered several names, and after the convention endorsed the selection unanimously, accepted the nomination and made a brief speech touching upon the issues of the campaign and the particular situation in York and Sunbury.

**OTHERS GIVE SPEECHES.**  
Others who spoke were P. J. Hughes, K. C., Hon. D. W. Mercer, Ernest W. Stairs and J. F. Winslow, K. C. Mr. Stairs opposed R. B. Hanson, K. C., the present Conservative candidate in this constituency, in a by-election in 1920 as a Progressive. All speakers gave strong approval of the candidate and promised him all support possible. Hon. Mr. Mercer said he had pledged himself to work for a few days for Dr. D. H. McAllister, Liberal candidate in Royal, but after that he would be free to campaign in York-Sunbury. Mr. Hughes spoke on the issues of the campaign and Mr. Winslow made particular reference to charges preferred against the Conservative candidate, R. B. Hanson, K. C., by an official of the court which are at present under consideration by a committee of the New Brunswick Bar Association.

## MAN FOUND DEAD

Quebec Posse Discovers Body; Death Caused by Exhaustion.

SCOTSTOWN, Que., Oct. 15.—Lionel Beauchamp, 27, of this town, was found dead in a tract of the Brompton Pulp and Paper Company's limits, near Lingwick, Tuesday. The man had left on a hunting trip on Saturday morning and failed to return. When no word was received from him yesterday, a large posse was organized to search for him. After combing the woods for many hours, the body was discovered. At the inquest a verdict of death from exhaustion was returned.

## London Has Boom In Hair Dressing Shops

LONDON, Oct. 15.—The popularity of bobbing and shingling has resulted in a great increase in the number of hairdressing shops for women in London and suburbs. The number now is nearly three times what it was two years ago. One Mayfair firm deals with 800 women customers a week, whereas before the days of bobbing and shingling the average number was 200. Hairdressers' shops are shooting up like mushrooms.

## CURRENT TRAVELS ON WATER STREAM

London Fireman is Electrocuted While Fighting Fire in Street Blaze.

LONDON, Oct. 15.—A London fireman was electrocuted at a fire recently, his death being due, it is believed, to the electric current from a broken cable traveling along the stream of water to the nozzle of the hose he was holding. The fireman was attending an outbreak of fire in the basement of Byron House, in Finsbury-street. At the time of the accident he was playing the hose on a burst of flames in the basement, where the electric cable had been severed in place. He suddenly threw up his hands and fell back unconscious. He was at once taken to St. Bartholomew's Hospital, where he died shortly afterwards. The fire was subdued without much damage being done. This is the first occasion on which the danger of electrocution at fires has been made so tragically apparent. It is customary to turn off the supply at the main in the case of both electricity and gas immediately the brigade arrive, but apparently this had not been done on this occasion.

## PROFESSOR GASSED ON DISCOVERY EVE

Seeking Insecticide That Would be Harmless to Human Lungs.

LONDON, Oct. 15.—An important advance in scientific knowledge is believed to depend on the recovery of Professor Howard Maxwell Lefroy, now lying unconscious at St. George's Hospital.

Saturday evening he was working in his "secret room" in the Imperial College of Science and Technology, at South Kensington, when he was overcome with gas and pulled out just in time to save his life. This is the second time this year Lefroy has been gassed while at work, and this time his assistants believe he was on the eve of a great discovery. He is a professor of entomology and for some years has been searching for an insecticide which, while fatal to insect life, would be innocuous to human lungs.

He has been experimenting with lewisite, which would have been used in the war if it had continued a few weeks longer, and is considered the last word in destructive gases. It is particularly dangerous as it is colorless, tasteless, odorless and almost impossible to detect if distributed as Lefroy was doing Saturday by an atomizer. No one knows the precise experiment on which he was at work, as he always is very reticent about his progress, but it is believed he had reached the crucial point of his investigations, and returned Saturday evening, contrary to his usual custom, for a few minutes to see how they were getting on.

## HEREDITY BLAMED IN BLOOD PRESSURE

Some Seemed Doomed to High Tension; Cause is Told by Lord Dawson.

TORONTO, Oct. 15.—The undoubted conclusion that a great deal of high blood pressure was caused by an in-born hereditary trait of character was the result of his research work emphasized by Lord Dawson in an address on "Reflections on High Blood Pressure," at the Academy of Medicine.

Some people, even young men and women, seem doomed; predestined, he said, no matter what happens. Anxiety and even mere anticipation is enough often to raise the blood pressure of such people to a very noticeable extent.

Discussing the causes of this apparently increasing disease of modern civilization, Lord Dawson ascribed the probable origin of the disease, when it was not due to chronic interstitial nephritis, a condition resulting from infection in the kidneys, to errors of metabolism, the assimilating of food by the body. He believed this to be the cause of those acquired cases which seem to be characteristic of middle age.
