FRANK OLIVER.
(Toronto Star)
Frank Oliver, to the great consolation of his family, is coming back to Ottawa to live, and to make life more interesting for his colleagues on the railway commission and also for the railways. Wherever he is, the virile philosopher is his own, especially when they are coupled in the vernacular of retribution which he can exact to the nth degree.

He appreciates the niceties of fate which has used the late Union Government first to divide and then to unite the fighting Franks of the Liberal party, which has a knack of renewing

its youth when it is said by its foes to be gasping in the very hour and article of death. Frank Oliver left the Old Man, they say in Quebec—three days after he had written him that he would never join "that gang". He stayed with the Union till he thought it had fulfilled its end, and then he took the railway commission chairmanship at a modest thousand dollars a month.

Frank Oliver stayed with the Old Man, lost his seat in the debate of December, 1917, and failed to recover it in '21. But, lo! in '23, at 70 years of age, he comes back to sit at the other Frank's right hand, and to deplore with him that sometimes folks will use stronger language than occasions warrant.

At Ottawa Frank Oliver has been a lifetime in newspaper harness, and a very long one in public life. He entered the world in Peel. His father Allan Bowsfield, he chose his mother's greater name. A printer here, he was a printer in Winnipeg. He rose to be foreman at the Free Press, and then, 43 years ago, with a Red River cart, a press, type and cologne, he set out for Edmonton to found the Bulletin, on sheets of wrapping paper, dodger size. At one time Edmonton was as legendary as Frank Oliver as Bossy is authentic as Doctor Johnson. All the stories of the copious originality of his diction were not true.

Three years after arriving at Edmonton he was sent to the council of the Northwest Territories as naturally as the March hare follows the south wind. When the Assembly was set up in 1898 he was elected to it, and stayed

there till the general election of 1898 carried him to Ottawa. Sometimes the good people of Regina set themselves on edge when they contemplate the noble fane in which Saskatchewan's business is transacted. They should remember the glories of a departed day when the Government of what are now the two provinces was inspired from a legislative chamber which was rather dry of furniture but abounded in rugged wisdom, much of it supplied by the vigorously original man from Edmonton.

Liberal Independent—more independent than Liberal. He loved not the immigration policy of Clifford Sifton, which was dotting the country east and west with a couple of hundred men. With all his critical capacity there was sometimes just a suggestion of the pioneering type represented by a couple of brothers in the Dauphin country of whom D. B. Hanna tells—when the railway came near their place they fled because, they said, the country was becoming too infernally populous.

Frank Oliver succeeded Clifford Sifton as Minister of the Interior, though Walter Scott was the favorite of many. But Walter was being reserved a few months for the premier of Saskatchewan. As an immigration minister, Frank Oliver had a supplanting smile. He mollified as many of them as he thought the auditor of Ottawa would approve of, with

good thing to bring hither as many as possible of those British people who went to chapel in preference to the established church. This was not because of any fervid devotion to the non-conformist conscience, but because he very believed that the sort of independence which sturdy nonconformity in England represented was the best sort of independence to encourage in Canada. Their religion was Frank's politics, to a refreshing degree.

For specimens of Frank Oliver's free and independent observations, take a couple arising from his first oceanic journey. He went over there expecting to find it his bounden duty to fire some of the staff, because, he said, they were mainly occupied with efforts to drink out of the same pot with the extent to which certain excellent men were becoming more English than the English.

Something else distressed him. Like natives of our self-dependent west on their first trip to the old world he was surprised by the quantity of French that were employed to achieve a paucity of result—especially around the Metropole, it seemed to him that every servant from every floor bobbed into the lobby, each with an open hand and a supplanting smile. He mollified as many of them as he thought the auditor of Ottawa would approve of, with
