RAID NETS SUSPECT, NUGGETS AND GEMS

Detectives Find Nitroglycerine and Burglars' Outfit After Capturing Their Man—On His Trail Five Days.

New York, Oct. 18.—A stack of gold nuggets, nitroglycerine and burglars' tools were found by detectives who captured William Anderson, 39, after trailing him to an apartment at 2408 Third avenue, on suspicion that he might have been connected with several burglaries. Detectives Kelly, Morrissey and Elwood Dwyer of the Safe and Lock Squad learned five days ago that Anderson was on a visit to this city. They sought him for five days and finally found the place where he was living. Climbing the stairs to his room, one of the detectives knocked at the door. There was a long pause, then a movement inside the room and the door was slowly opened by a slender, thin, gray-haired man. One detective stuck an adequate foot inside the door and all three grabbed Anderson. The venerable craftsman

CONQUERING FOG.

(Vancouver Sun)

Great progress in laying equatorial fogs has been made in experiments in Pittsburgh, where a spray of oil and organic acids prevented mist from forming at the contact point of cold air and water.

These experiments may prove of incalculable value to navigation.

Heavy fogs at the time of the fall and spring equinoxes constitute the greatest menace to shipping in all parts of the world.

It is quite within the limits of possibility that the near future may see development of the apparatus used at Pittsburgh forming part of the standard equipment on every ship, and making it possible for navigators to lay heavy fogs in the immediate vicinity at least.

WILL ASK BIDS FOR THE MUSQUASH WOOD

DOCTORS PRESCRIBE COAL.

Chicago Dealer Shows Blanks Urging Preference in Delivery.

Chicago, Oct. 18.—With hints of winter weather before the coal shortage is relieved, Chicago physicians have found a new use for their prescription blanks, according to Marshall Keig, a coal company official, who exhibited a large batch of vari-colored pills, all urging that certain consumers, because of illness or other emergencies, be preferred in coal distribution.

"This avalanche of doctors' prescriptions for fuel is a novelty and we do not know just how to regard it," said Mr. Keig. "However, the presumption in each instance must be that the case is one demanding special consideration."

GIRL CAUGHT BY STRAND OF WIRE FASTENED TO MOTOR CAR MAY DIE

New York, Oct. 18.—Some one's notion of a joke may cause the death of Ethel Kauper, fifteen years old, of Yonkers, who stepped from the curb of Herriot street, Yonkers, just as an automobile went by.

John Duane of Yonkers was driving the car. Unknown to him, a snakebird had fastened a long strand of wire to the rear of the car. As the car went along the wire writhed out behind like a snake, wrapped itself about a girl, threw her to the ground and dragged her twenty feet before Duane heard her screams and stopped his car. At St. Joseph's Hospital it was found that Miss Kauper had received a fracture of the skull and several lacerations and bruises.
