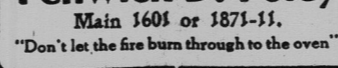

MARINE NOTES.

The steamer Shenandoah has arrived safely in Halifax harbor, steaming from St. John under her own steam in her damaged condition. She will be placed on the dry dock in Halifax and repairs made as soon as possible. Steamer Indian Prince (Br.), from Santos, etc., for New York, is believed to have been sunk by a German cruiser. An Ottawa despatch says: The wreck of government steamer Montagny, which went down in the St. Lawrence Friday morning after collision with steamer Langan (Nor.), has been located, but the high winds have so far prevented diving operations, though the vessel is in only 35 feet of water.

RECENT DEATHS

Captain John Wagner died at his home, Black River, on Saturday, aged forty-eight. He was owner of the schooner Ronald and had been captain of her for several years, retiring about a year ago on account of ill health. He sailed between St. John and New York and for some years was one of the captains employed by J. Willard Smith. He was unmarried and is survived by one sister, Mrs. John Cochrane of Braintree, Mass. Richard and Thomas Evans of this city are uncles and Mrs. James Sprout of Princess street, is an aunt. The funeral was held at noon today and was attended by many friends. Interment was in the Church of England burying ground at Black River.

The news of the death of Miss Carrie P. Hawkes, daughter of David Hawkes, of Sussex, was heard with deep regret by a large number of friends. She was fifteen years of age and lived with her aunt, Mrs. John Hawkes of Newtown.

The death of Rt. Rev. Monsignor T. J. Daly, vicar-general of the archdiocese of Halifax, occurred yesterday in his 75th year. He celebrated his golden jubilee last July. Mgr. Daly was one of the most highly esteemed Catholic clergy in Eastern Canada.

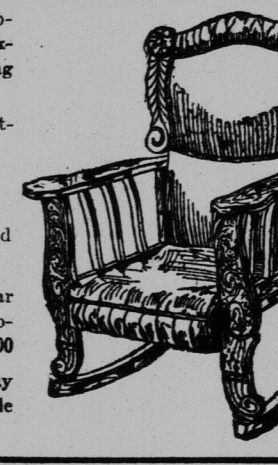

MANSLAUGHTER IS VERDICT IN BRAMAN CASE

After deliberating for three hours and forty-one minutes on Saturday evening the jury in the case of John H. Braman, charged with the murder of Special Policeman Frank O'Leary, brought in a verdict of manslaughter. The prisoner was remanded to jail until next Friday, when sentence will be delivered. He took the verdict calmly and apparently without a great deal of concern.

At the opening of the afternoon session the attorney-general resumed his address. He urged the jury to disregard the plea of sympathy, but to judge the case clearly on the evidence. Judge Crockett commenced the charge at 2.30. He defined murder and manslaughter. By the mere fact that Braman attempted to escape from lawful custody, and in so doing inflicted injuries which he should have known were likely to endanger the life of the officer, he was guilty of manslaughter. If the evidence went to show that he shot the officer intentionally and with disregard of what effect it would have, he was guilty of murder.

His Honor carefully and very clearly outlined the points of law involved. From his charge he gave it to be understood that because of the fact that O'Leary was an officer taking Braman into lawful custody, acquittal was out of the question—on the mere ground that the shooting was an accident for which the counsel for the defence asked for it.

WITH BRITISH EMPIRE

Germany, having grasped her sword, is laying about her with a high hand. She is playing the outlaw against western Europe. Her ultimate purpose in violating international treaties is clear. If she could have beaten the armies of France and Russia, with Britain holding aloof, she would have attained the complete dominance of Europe and become a menace to both American continents. Thinking people in the United States are with the British empire of freedom and liberty against the German empire of autocracy and suppression.—New York Evening Post.

CACUONA ASHORE

The steamer Cacuna, from St. John's for Sydney, N. S., ran ashore yesterday in a hurricane, near Cape Race. She will be a total loss, but her crew were saved.

Chief of Police Clark has a letter from attorneys in Boston asking for information regarding the whereabouts of Edward McDonald Walsh, who is supposed to be living in St. John. The chief is anxious that if Walsh is now in St. John, he should report to him and learn something to his advantage.
