WALL STREET NOTES OF TODAY

(By direct private wire to J. C. Mackintosh & Co.)
New York, April 10—Americans in London steady, 4 to 5 % up.
London settlement began today.
Decision day in supreme court.
City Chamberlain Hyde defends his administration and says not a dollar of city money has been lost or was in jeopardy.
Print cloth market showed fair amount of trading with sales estimated at 100,000 pieces.
President Taft gives assurance that he had no intention of proroguing extra session of congress.
U. S. Steel will issue today statement of untitled tonnage as of March 31.
Thirty-seven roads reporting weekly losses for fourth week of March show net declines of \$275,391, equal to 1.44 per cent. Saturday's bank statement shows decreases in all principal items as compared with previous week.
Imports of pig iron and exports of tinplate make new high records for eight months ended February 29.
Twelve industrial advanced 17 per cent. Twenty active railroads unchanged.
So, February's gross increase \$22,236; February's net decrease \$49,502; eight months gross decrease \$1,892,373; eight months net decrease \$1,838,111.
Chicago division, February net decrease \$70,914; eight months net decrease \$778,658.
Between 2000 and 3000 cabooses—lots of wood and canvas on bobolocks drawn by coon—are now on the way from Edmonton, Alberta, to what is called the Peace River district, or Grand Prairie. Thousands more will start soon. These cabooses are the travelling houses of settlers, or homesteaders, who will take up thousands of acres of government land in the newly opened district.
