The discovery of a formula more or less humiliating to Servia by which wanton and unnecessary war may be averted in the Balkans is less important than the sudden intervention of Germany in Russian diplomacy with overmastering effect. The Russian Foreign Minister, instead of consulting France and England, with whom he has been acting for many months on Balkan affairs, has abruptly recognized the validity of the Austrian action annexing Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is not yet clear whether this change of front is Zealand has made it an imperial issue over, the Char, or what pressure was brought to bear on St. Petersburg, but the processes of Sir Edward Grey's diplomacy were suddenly interrupted, and the Triple Alliance was reinforced from an opposite coalition. Berlin has become the centre of power in the settlement of the Eastern question, the balance of power created by the two coalitions has been overthrown, and Austria-Hungary has been left to act at her own discretion in the Balkans, while Germany regains her supremacy in Continental diplomacy. The German Emperor's coup de main may bring about peace, unless Austria-Hungary is bent on crushing Servia, distracted by dynastic scandals and virtually defenceless, but the mailed list in European diplomacy is not a pleasant apparition before English eyes.
