ROYAL COURT NOT LIKELY

Duke Coming to Ottawa Will Not Interfere With Course of Affairs at Rideau—May Court Club.

Ottawa, Feb. 14.—Society is wondering whether the appointment of the Duke of Connaught as governor general of Canada will mean the creation of anything like a royal court regime at Rideau Hall. That the formalities and restrictions of London court life will be attempted here is, of course, out of the question, but it has been thought in some quarters that the accession of the King's uncle to the vice-regal post when Earl Grey retires next September, may mean a revision of the invitation list and something of a restriction of the right of social entry at Government House.

So far as can be learned, nothing of the kind will result. It is expected that things will continue at Rideau Hall much as they have during the residence there of the Earl and Countess Grey and their predecessors and kinsmen, the Minto. Social entertainments are, it is understood, to be managed in much the same way, and invitations issued as usual, according to political and civil rank.

There will have to be some modification probably of the rules now surrounding the drawing room, with which the governor general and his wife open Parliament. At present anybody from near to peasant, if properly attired, may be received at the drawing room, and as a general thing the attendance runs from 600 to 1,000. But such is the popular interest in royalty, especially among women, that the Duke and Duchess of Connaught probably will be obliged, if no restrictions are imposed, to receive several thousand persons. That would mean a suffocating crush in the present state of the accommodations in the senate house where the drawing room is held.

Society Vaudeville Planned. That ceaselessly active organization the May Court Club, has now gone into vaudeville. The governor general and the Countess Grey have given their patronage to the entertainment that the clever young women of the club and some of their men friends will put on at the Russell Theatre Wednesday evening. The proceeds will be given to the children's ward of the Water street hospital. So diligent have been the efforts of Miss Margaret Fitzpatrick, daughter of Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, chief justice of Canada, that a big success is promised, for there is considerable amateur histrionic talent. There is to be a French maids' chorus, which is talked of as a great hit. Skirts will be worn nine inches from the ground.

The May Court grew out of one of the many activities of the Countess of Aberdeen, whose husband was governor general of Canada in 1898. She conceived the idea of organizing a society of women to Rideau Hall on May 1st of that year, and in an address to them, suggested the revival of the May Day customs. Miss Ethel Hamilton was chosen May Queen, and a beautiful outdoor ceremony was the result. Later in the same year Miss Hamilton brought about the formation of a May Court Club for the purpose of "according girls of leisure opportunities of improving their own talents and characters, and of helping girls with less time at their disposal."

The organization now has a series of debates every winter, is frequently addressed by persons prominent in the world of art, literature and science, and maintains a public dispensary and promotes a great deal of valuable charitable work. Miss Elizabeth Borden, daughter of Frederick Borden, minister of militia, is the May Queen this year.

CANADIAN SEES DAY OF DANGER

Correspondent to Standard Interprets Advances of U. S. as Aimed at British Sovereignty in Canada.

To the Editor of The Standard.

Sir,—The opinion obtains in certain circles on both sides of the sea that Canada is nearing the parting of the ways, and that important and far-reaching changes are impending. Some are hoping for closer relationship with the mother land and her overseas dominions, and the strengthening of the ties that bind us to each other by the adoption of some form of Imperial federation. Some advocate independence and these get aid and comfort from the frequent and sympathetic allusions made thereto in the address of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, delivered on both sides of the border. A few others favor annexation to the United States, preferring to enter the Union by negotiation rather than by compulsion, satisfied the final issue would be absorption if independence was adopted and therefore they favor the shorter route.

To bring this about has been from the first the purpose of the government of the United States, and in sermon, song and story the people have been led to say: "No point up Ulica contracts our powers; this vast unbounded continent is ours."

And to convince us of their earnestness they have had recourse to war, to hostile tariffs, to the raid of the marauder and by frequent encroachments upon our territory. All these having failed, and Canada unheeding alike armed and unarmed, they have now, went on developing her resources and widening the sphere of her commercial operations.

Now a halt. A complete change of programme is made, and a new order of procedure is adopted. The cannon and the rifle are laid aside, and the eagle there is the cooing of the dove, and with an unheard of generosity the gates are thrown open to the United States, and the American people may be shared in by the Canadians. Such broad-mindedness is uncommon, is actually bewildering, and is especially so because it comes from Washington, Canada a reason for this surprising change of front be given. Perhaps President Taft is a wiser man than some of our predecessors, he has learned that Canada with Great Britain behind her is not to be bullied. The Venezuelan and Seal Fishery questions taught him he knew the party in power at present in Ottawa could probably be handled. Had not that party done its best to prevent the union of the scattered provinces of British North America? Had it not opposed the purchase of the Northwest in which the great wheat regions are located? Had it not thrown every possible obstacle in the way of the building of the Canadian Pacific Railway? Had it not denounced the National Policy under which Canada had become what she is today? Had it not sought to take Nova Scotia out of the Confederation? And then did he (Taft) not know it had advocated continental free trade and unrestricted reciprocity, and was not aware of the fact that a large number of American settlers had not taken the oath of allegiance and could be counted upon as his helpers. And knowing all this he naturally concluded such a party could be handled. He invited its representatives to Washington. They went, they were wine and dined, and caught, and have accepted proposals which are humiliating, and which if agreed to by the Canadian parliament can only have one issue—our severance from the mother land. Are we willing to pay such a price for the privilege of writing ourselves Americans? The answer should be in tones of thunder. No, a thousand times No.

FELIX HEBERT HOTEL BURNS AT EDMONDSTON

Building and Furniture Totally Destroyed While Guests Narrowly Escape With Lives—Loss Placed at \$10,000.

Edmondston, N. B., Feb. 14.—Fire broke out a few minutes before one o'clock this morning in the Felix Hebert Hotel, of which J. M. Sirola was proprietor. Before closing the house for the night the clerk went into the kitchen to see that all was well and found it a mass of flames. It is thought the fire was caused by flames from a gas light, which they had been thawing water pipes in the cellar yesterday, catching in the walls of the cellar, and burning slowly all day. All the furniture in the building was destroyed and most of the guests barely escaped with their lives. The supply of water was very low and the firemen fought the flames mostly with snow.
