NEW CUNARD LINE STEAMER ARRIVES AT MONTREAL

Digby Shipping—The Battle Line—Recent Chart-ers—Vessel Bottom Up.

BOOBY SHIPPING.

The Bark Edna M. Smith, Captain J. A. Read, cleared Saturday for Buenos Ayres with 722,319 feet of lumber, valued at \$13,000, and shipped by Messrs. Clarke Bros. The bark is delayed here for want of a mate. The rest of the crew is complete.

A NEW CUNARD LINER.

Montreal, July 28.—The new Cunard liner Andania arrived in port yesterday on her maiden voyage from Southampton. Captain Miller today expressed himself as well pleased with the vessel's behavior on the passage out, and the passengers were unanimous in their appreciation of the boat's accommodations. Being a new ship, no attempt was made to test the speed of the Andania, and as a dense fog was experienced for three days it would have been impossible. Including detention caused by the fog, which totalled 47 hours, 34 minutes, the Andania covered the 2,152 miles from Bishop's Rock, outside of Southampton, to Father Point, in 7 days, 20 hours, 36 minutes, an average speed of 13.32 knots an hour. She brought 1,395 passengers, of whom 440 were cabin and 955 third class.

The six master Addie M. Lawrence, which was quite badly damaged by collision below Philadelphia several weeks since, has come off the dry dock at New York, where she was taken for repairs. She left there on Thursday for Philadelphia, where she will take on a cargo of coal for Portland.

Captain Home of the White Star liner Cymric reports on July 21 in lat. 48° 8' N, lon 24° 43' W, passed a ship bottom up, directly in the path of shipping.

Deering, from Mobile for Boston, passed in this morning with bowsprit gone close to bow; vessel leaking and able to carry only fore, main and mainmast sails.
