

## WANDERERS DEFEATED CANADIENS

Montreal, Jan. 22.—In one of the most strenuous contests seen in local hockey circles this winter, the Wanderers scored a single goal victory over the Canadiens tonight, defeating them four to three. The match was played before the largest audience of the present season, six thousand being in attendance. The play was replete with thrills and sensational rushes and the pace was so fast at the start that the teams slowed down perceptibly before the finish. Freedom from roughness was a feature.

## DRUCKE RELEASED BY M'GRAW

New York, Jan. 22.—Manager McGraw of the New York National League Club announced today that Pitcher Louis Drucker has been released to the Sacramento Club, Pacific Coast League. Drucker joined the Giants in 1909 and the following season gave promise of developing into a star. In the winter of 1910-11 he hurt his shoulder in a subway accident and won a verdict against the traction company for injury to his pitching arm. McGraw sent Drucker to Toronto under an optional agreement early last summer and recalled him in September, but was not satisfied that he would return to form.
