REACTION IN THE MARKET DURING THE LAST HOUR

Market Made Some Further Advance After Declaration of Regular Bethlehem Steel Dividend and Held Position Fairly Well Until Just Before Close.

(McDUGALL & COWANS). New York, Jan. 29.—The market made some further advance after the declaration of regular Bethlehem Steel dividend and held its position fairly well until the last hour when a general reaction of one to two points took place. This was attributed to profit-taking on the part of the cautious investors in the Steel Corporation's dividend action after the close when it was announced that the U. S. Steel paid regular dividend of 1 1/4 and three per cent extra as usual.

SIR LOMER GOUIN SUBMITS PLAN TO COUNCIL

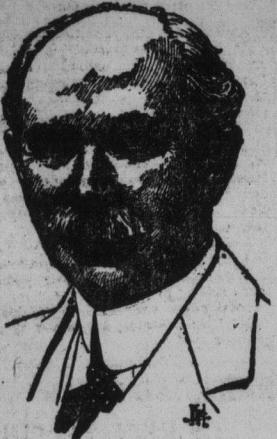

LESS TALK AND MORE WORK IN NEWPORT, R. I.

Toronto, Jan. 29.—"First let us get that 100,000 men overseas through the military service and then let us have common sense and progress. That is what Canada wants now," said Hon. Robert Rogers, former minister of public works in the late Borden administration, who is a visitor to Toronto.

Sued James A. Patterson for Commission for Sale of Property at Hampton.

Hampton, Jan. 29.—An adjourned sitting of the Kings County Court was held here today. His Honor Judge Josiah presiding. The only case to come to hearing was that of Guy Kierstead vs. James A. Patterson. The plaintiff was represented by Horace A. Porter of St. John and the defendant by Daniel Mullin, K. C. This action was brought to recover a claim of one hundred dollars as commission on a sale of a property at Hampton known as the Hendrick's property.

BAD BOLSHIEV K SLAUGHTER 22

Break Up Meeting of Workmen and Soldiers' Delegates at Toms.

Harbin, Manchuria, Jan. 29.—Twenty-two persons were killed in a fight at Toms, when the Bolshevik broke up a meeting of workmen's and soldiers' delegates. Despatches received from Blagovestchensk, in Siberia, and capital of the province of Amur, say that the Bolsheviks have wrecked the local assembly, and that fighting and robbery are general.

The Russian consul-general, Popoff, at Harbin, is on his way to Peking to present to the representative of the Entente Allies a plan for raising a force to free Eastern Siberia of the Bolsheviks, and to protect against Austro-German prisoners being released.

FIRE PANIC NEAR PIER

People Feared Explosion of Ammunition - Blaze at Trenton, N. S., and Another at St. Lambert, Que.—Other Costly Fires.

Halifax, Jan. 29.—Fire which broke out this morning in a freight shed at the south end of the terminal where ammunition was stored, started a panic. People in that district, fearful of an explosion, sped to their homes and ran north. The street cars were stopped and there was evidence of alarm on the part of the authorities as workmen employed at the terminals were ordered to go north. The fire only lasted five minutes.
