$_{\rm coming}$  bi-centenary of the Battle of the Boyne, would recommend the following to your consideration :

1. That large demonstrations should be held at suitable places in the various Provinces within the jurisdiction of this M. W. Grand Lodge.

2. That the selection of the places be left in the hands of the Provincial Grand Lodges.

3. That a Committee be appointed to make railway arrangements and prepare a series of resolutions which shall be presented at the next meeting of this M. W. Grand Lodge.

BI-CENTENARY.

Moved by Bro. Rev. Dr. Badenoch, D. G. C. E., seconded by Bro. Rev. Dr. Kane, G. M., Belfast, and

Resolved.—(No. 22) That the following memorandum of suggestions, with respect to the Bi-centenary of the Revolution Settlement of 1688, be adopted by the Council:

1. That each Grand Lodge make arrangements to commemorate, in their own jurisdiction, this event.

2. That at the next Triennial Meeting of the Council this great event be commemorated.

3. That the proceedings be opened by a sermon.

4 That each Grand Lodge appoint one or more of their brethren to prepare papers to be read on any one of the following subjects: The state of religion in Great Britain and Ireland. The position of the country at 168s, The Life and History of King William, Prince of Orange. The history and principles of the Settlement of 168s. The history and principles of the Orange Orangeanization. The state and position of Orangeism in the respective quarters of the world; and the duty of Protestants to maintain and defend the Protestant religion, as the only and sure foundation of civil and religious liberty.

5. That such papers, when approved, be printed in a volume, and circulated throughout the Order in all parts of the world. Such papers not to exceed thirty minutes.

6. That the following be a committee to arrange the business of the next Triennial Council, to receive these papers, which should be in the hands of the Secretary not later than a month before the meeting of the Council, viz.: The President, Bros. Rev. Dr. Potter, Dr. Miller, Rev. Dr. Kane, W. Johnston M.P. (Ballykilbeg), W. Touchstone, Rev. Dr. Badenoch, and the Secretary.
