Joyce (who had left Windsor for the Arctic) via KDKA Pittsburgh. It was a novelty in those early days of "wireless". Lindbergh had just flown the Atlantic, and Paul Robeson was at the top of his form. I recall the day when the cables of the Ambassador Bridge connected Canada with U.S.A.

Nowadays, I do an occasional duty at the Royal Ascot Races, the Epsom Derby, and the Goodwood Races. Sometimes I wonder how many exmembers live in the U.K. now?
