Lawrence (or Lake St. Peter) nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the fame, and that the feventh of the faid Counties to be called Riche. lieu, shall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province on the foutherly fide of the faid River St. Lawrence, between the westerly fide of the faid County of Buck. inghamshire and the following lines, that is to fay, a line running fouth-east from the westerly angle of a tract of land commonly called the Seigniory of. St. Ours, until the fame fhill interfect the eafterly bank of the River Sorel. otherwife called the River Richelieu or Chambly, thence up the eafterly bank of the north eafterly bounds of a tract of land commonly called the Seigniory of Rouville, and thence by a line running fouth eaft to the limits of Our faid Province. together with all the Islands in the River St. Lawrence (or Lake St. Peter.) nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the fame, and toge. ther also with all the Islands in the River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the lame, including in the faid County the tract of lar d comprehended within the limits of the Town or Borough of William Henry herein after described; and that the eighth of the faid Counties to be called Bedford, shall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province on the eafterly fide of the River Sorel, other wife called the Richelieu or Chambly, between the faid River and the wefterly fide of the aforeland County of Rich-lieu, together with all the Islands in the faid River Sorel otherwife called Richelieu or Chambly neareft to the faid County and in the whole or in part fronting the fame; and that the ninth of the faid Counties to be called Surrey, shall comprchend all that part of Our (and Province on the foutherly fide of the River St. Law. rence, between that River and the River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly, and between the afore-mentioned fouth east line running from the westerly angle of the tract of land called the Seignicity of St. Ours and a line parallel thereto, running from the wefterly angle of a tract of land commonly called the Seigniory of Varrennes, together with all the Islands in the faid River St. Lawrence nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in pan fronting the same, and together allo with all the Islands in the River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the laid County, and in the whole or in part opposite thereto on that fide ; and that the tenth of the faid Counties to be called Kent, fhall comprehend all that part of our faid Province on the fontherly fide of the River St. Lawrence between that River and the river Solel, Richelisu or Chambly, and between the westerly fide of the faid County of Surrey and a line parallel thereto running from the wefterly angle of atract of land commonly called the Barony of Longueuil, together with all the Islands in the faid river St. Lewrence nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the fame; and together also with all the Islands in the faid River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part opposite thereto on that side; and that the eleventh of the faid Counties to be called Huntingdon, shall comprehendall the reft of Our faid Province of Lower Canada on the foutherly fide of the faid River St. Lawrence, together with all the Islands in the faid River St. Lawrence and in the River Sorel, otherwife called the Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the faid County; and that the twelfth of the faid Counties to be called York fhall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province of Lower Canada on the northerly fide of the faid River St. Lawrence, between the uppermost limus thereof and a line running west north west from the south easterly angle of a tract of land commonly called the Seigniory of Dumont, together with the Islands of Perot and Bizarre, and all the other Islands in the Rivers St. Lawrence and Ottowas nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or
