## BILL.

An Act to repeal the Act relative to the Registering of Vessels employed solely in Navigating the Inland Waters of this Province.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Government in England have signified their intention to cause to be vested in the proper officers of the Customs, at such of the Inland 4 Ports in this Province as the Governor shall from time to time designate, the powers necessary to enable them to. 6 Register British Vessels at such Inland Ports, and to carry into effect the provisions of the Act of the Parlia-8 ment of the United Kingdom, passed in the session held in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's Reign, and 10 intituled, " An Act for the Registering of British Vessels," and the said Act, which hath hitherto been (as had 12 been also the former Acts of the said Parliament for the like purpose) inapplicable to Vessels employed solely in 14 navigating the Inland Waters of this Province, by reason of the impossibility of carrying its provisions into effect 16 with regard to them in the absence of such powers, will be thereby effectively extended to such Vessels, and the 18 Provincial Act hereinafter mentioned will become unnecessary: Be it therefore enacted, &c.

Preamble.

Dand it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that Acts Vic. CAR. the Provincial Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majes- 5, repealed. 22 ty's Reign, and intituled, "An Act to secure the right of "property in British Plantation Vessels. Navigating the 24" Inland Waters of this Province, and not registered under "the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the United King-26" dom, passed in the third and fourth years of the Reign "of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, 28" An Act for the Registering of British Vessels, and to "facilitate transfers of the same, and to prevent the frau-30 " dulent assignment of any property in such Vessels," shall be repealed from and after the day of 32 now next: Provided always, that notwithstanding such Proviso: as to repeal, all things theretofore done under the provisions of things done under it, &c.

34 the said Act, and all rights theretofore acquired by virtue of such provisions, shall remain good and valid, and may 36 be enforced, and all penalties and forfeitures theretofore incurred under such provisions, may be sued for and

38 recovered, as if the said Act were not repealed.
