Rev. Sir,-

In reply to your letter or 27th ultimo, regarding the conviction of Gabriel E. Poitras for the sele of liquor to Edward Francis, an Indian of the Tobique Reserve, I beg to say that, owing to the extenuating circumstances in favour of Poltras - that the sale of liquor was made by his bartender in his absence and without his knowledge; that the bartender was ignorant of the law, and that, even had he known its provisions, there was nothing in the Indian's appeerance (as result of admixture of white blood) to lead any one unacquainted with him to suspect als race - the Department decided not to press for the collection of the fine and would consider it satisfactory if the costs were paid and the fine postponed until another conviction obtained.
