

accompany each delivery of supplies. I have to point out that note "c" at the end of the descriptive index to the schedule provides for this, and that, as the contracts are based on the tender, the failure to provide an invoice, or packing account, with each delivery is as much a breach of contract as the substitution of a sack of 97 lbs for one of 100 lbs of flour.

In the schedule for the coming year this requirement will be more strongly insisted on.

The Inspector is under a misapprehension as to the "Revised" sack twinning being delivered in remounts. Such is not the case.
