Friday, June 15

En route for Matachewan at 9.30
after delay for paddles. Up Bay
Lake 7 miles, ^{Pass 13 miles} 2 miles to Port
rapids while Indians pole up
with loads half-way. Eight
miles beyond we cross the mouth
of the ^{Matachewan} ~~Matachewan~~ river ^{shortly} ~~shortly~~
afterwards ^{Mogogash Creek} ~~the~~ ~~mouth~~ - look
on west side. Camp at 5.45
twelve miles from Latchford.
Extremely hot & flies fearful.
Rain about 9 P.M.

Saturday - June 16.

Sultry morning. Start at
8.30. Nine miles to foot of the
Curve rapids. Indians pole - we
walk. Three miles beyond we
land at the foot of ^(mountain) Round Lake
rapids - portage 300 yds.
