- A I was able to get them. I had my rejection papers and things from the Army.
- Q Which rejection paper did you have ?
- A The one I obtained in 1942.
- Q You used it to satisfy the Selective Service that you were military exempt ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q You knew however that you weren't ?
- A Yes, Sir.
