time

servants of the said Corporation, as may be required for the due management of the affairs thereof, and to allow to them respectively a reasonable and suitable remuneration; and all officers so appointed shall have the right to exercise such other powers and authorities for the due management and administration of the affairs of the said Corporation, as may be conferred upon them by the regulations and by-laws of the said Corporation.

Annual Report to the Legislature.

5. The said Corporation shall be bound to make annual Reports to both branches of the Legislature, containing a general statement of the affairs of the Corporation, which said reports shall be presented within the first twenty days of every Session of the Legislature.

Public Act.

6. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.

CAP. XCV.

An Act to incorporate the Société de l'Union St. Roch.

[Assented to 9th June, 1862.]

Preamble.

THEREAS an Association, under the name of the Société de l'Union St. Roch, has existed for several months in the Parish of St. Roch, in the city of Quebec, having for its object the aid of its members in case of sickness, and the ensuring of like assistance and other advantages to the widows and children of deceased members; And whereas the members of the said Association have prayed to be incorporated, and it is expedient to grant their petition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

Institution incorporated.

1. Joseph Breton, Louis Lepine, Telesphore Routier, Joseph Roussin, Paul Carrier, Joseph Lajeunesse, François X. Chabot and Joseph Blondeau, together with such other persons as now are members of the said institution, or may be reafter become members thereof, in virtue of this Act, shall be and they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, in fact and in name, under the name of the Société de l'Union St. Roch, and by that name shall have power, from time to time, and at any time hereafter, to purchase, acquire, possess, hold, exchange, accept and receive for themselves and their successors, all lands, tene-Amount of real ments and hereditaments, and all real or immoveable estate; being and situated in Lower Canada, necessary for the actual use and occupation of the said Corporation, but not exceeding

in annual value at any time the sum of five thousand dollars, and the said property to hypothecate, sell, alienate and dispose of, and to acquire other instead thereof for the same purposes; and any majority of the said Corporation, for the
