Sad Drowning Accident

A message was received this a.m. from the operator at Terrenceville informing the authorities of a sad drowning accident yesterday. The message is as follows:

Yesterday p.m. Mr. Isaac Burke saw Mr. Ryan's and Mr. Clinton's yacht in trouble. He immediately left the Island and reported the matter at St. Jacques. Dr. Fitzgerald and two men, Tibbo, and Mr. Burke left for the rescue. They collided with the "Hump." Mr. Burke was drowned. Doctor Fitzgerald and two men were saved. Grave fears are entertained for Ryan and Clinton.

Mr. Clinton is well and favourably known in St. John's. He has been connected with the Customs at St. Jacques for a number of years as Sub-Collector. Mr. Burke was a prominent merchant of St. Jacques and his death under such sad circumstances will be deeply regretted by his many friends here in the city.
