U. S. CONSUL M'COOK DEAD

Succumbs to Pneumonia at His Old Home in Philadelphia.

Philadelphia, Nov. 20 .- James C. McCook, United States Consul at Dawson, Y. T., is dead from pneumonia. His successor has not yet been named.

(The above brief message received this morning does not give the exact date of Consul McCook's death, which was trobably on the 19th. The news is not a surprise, as the necessed has been in poor health for the past year, being sich nearly all the time when last in Dawson. One of his sons died in the Cuban war and another is in business in Philadelphia, the home of the family. A widow survives, but the husband and wife had not lived together for a number of years. Mr. McCook, through the influence of Senator Matt Quay of Pennsylvania, was appointed to the U. S. consulate of Dawson early in '98, arriving to take charge of the position soon after receiving his commission, He remained here until near the close of navigation in '99, when he went outside for the winter, leaving Mr. Ronald Morrison as vice-consul. He returned early in 1900, spending the summer here and again going out in the fall, Mr. H. Te Roller being left as vice-consul, the same appointment being made the last time the consul returned to the States. The appointment of a U. S. consul, like all ministerial appointments, is one of political preferment. It is likely that a temporary appointment will be made soon, but it is possible that the position will not be permanently filled for some months.)

McLean Bros. Will Begin Construction Work In Early Spring.

Vancouver, Nov. 20 .- McLean Bros. announce that all arrangements have been completed and that they will commence work early in the spring on the construction of the Klondike Creeks Railroad under the charter granted to Thomas W. O'Brien and associates, the line leading from Dawson to the various creeks.

The main line will lead up Bonanza and Eldorado and on across the divide to Indian river.

The object is to superquently extend the road to Stewart river and on to the mouth of the Pelly opposite Fort Selkirk. The construction is so planned that the road will form a link in an all-Canadian line which parties with whom McLean Bros. are identified, presumably McKenzie & Mann, promise soon to undertake.


