During the interregnam the Camingtingho exercises all the Papal power even coining of money, with his own arms on one side and crossed keys on the other. The corpse of the Pope is to be washed in odoriferous waters, embalmed and exposed in full canonicals first in the Pauline Chapel, and next in the Chapel of Sextus V., in the Vatican, where the body is laid on a bed of state, surrounded by innumerable tapers. The feet protrude through an iron balastrade to be kissed by the people. On the ninth day after death the corpse is put into a coffin, together with sixty coronation medials of gold, silver and brass, which are mingled together to show that death equals all things. Then the Pope with all pomp and ceremony, is buried in the first Basilica of the Catholic world. On the earliest convenient day of the Cationia, habited in their copes, are convened to bear a Mass of the Holy Ghost in St. Peter's. Thence they proceed to the Pauline Chapol of the Vatican; there the Cardinal-Deacon reads the Bull of Election; and subsequently they retire to their several cells. All the spectators, save two are forthwith summoned to attend the con reads the Bull of Election, subsequently they retire to their several cells. All the spectators, save two masters of ceremonics, a secretary, a surgeon, are ordered masters of ceremonics, a secretary, as physician, and a surgeon, are ordered to withdraw; and the Marshal of the Church locks all the doors of the Vatican. The Cardinals leave their cells but once a day to hear mass, and to deliver their rections are secretary.
