CLOSE OF FISHERIES COMMISSION Particulars Not Yet Available. ASSENT OF THE SENATE DOUBTFUL. DEBATE ON THE ADDRESS IN REPLY

HALIFAX, N.S., Feb. 16. Last night the Fisheries Commissioners completed their labors by signing the treaty. All the commissioners gave their full concur-It relates exclusively to the fisheries, but the particulars are still secret.

The sanction of the Queen and the parliaments of Canada and Newfoundland is expected, but the assent of the American Senate is doubtful. The treaty is regarded as a perma nent settlement of difficulties.

The revenue of Canada shows a large increase over last year. The Province of Ontario gives a surplus of nearly half a million. The debate on the address in the British Parliament continues.

We believe a wharf is being erected by Messrs. Harvey & Co., at the bottom of the harbor.
