SOLIGNUM.
 Remarkable Test! Locally made by Messrs. W. & G. RENDELL.
 Solignum as a preservative for wood against the attack of termites, we tried a piece of 2 x 4 spruce, about two feet long, by painting one-third with Solignum, leaving the rest in the water about one foot from the bottom, immersing a pile of stones the remains of a sunken wharf in the place where our Wharf Shores are eaten off first. After three months, on taking it up at the end of that time, we found the piece painted with Solignum had hardly begun to decay, while the unpainted piece had decayed to the heart of it. As a test of some brands of Copper Paint we had a similar piece of wood treated at both ends, the centre third clear, this was in exactly the same place as the Solignum test for three months and when taken up the painted ends were perfect but the unpainted ends were rotten to the heart.
 These pieces of wood are to be seen at our Office, interested in the preservation of Wharf Piles or any other work.
