### Square Holes Are Cut With New Drilling Tool

One more problem of the carpenter has been solved, it is claimed, with the invention of an ingenious tool that drills square holes. Two screws fasten the box-shaped tool head to the place where the hole is wanted. A brace then is attached and the drilling started. The clean-cut hole measures 3/4 inches by 3/4 inches. For plaster walls, the screw holes are so arranged that screws inserted in two of the three holes provided are bound to catch the laths.

## Skeletons 50,000 Years Old


