RAIN OR SLEET—WARMER.

TORONTO, March 14—11 p.m.—The depression central near Kingston yesterday is now moving off the Atlantic coast, and has caused a moderate gale with rain or snow in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec. Higher pressure and fine, colder weather has followed over Ontario. In the northwest pressure continues low, with moderate temperature and a light fall of snow in the Red River district.

Minimum and maximum temperatures: Calgary, 22°-40°; Edmonton, 16°-36°; Qu'Appelle, 26°-36°; Winnipeg, 20°-20°; Port Arthur, 4°-30°; Parry Sound, 14°-28°; Toronto, 26°-34°; Kingston, 24°-34°; Montreal, 34°-34°; Quebec, 28°-32°; Halifax, 26°-42°.

TORONTO, March 15—1 p.m.—Probabilities for the next 24 hours for the lower lakes region (covering the peninsula and as far east as Belleville) are: Increasing cloudiness and east to south winds, followed by some rain or sleet; slowly rising temperature.

—The London Amateur Opera Company has fully organized again, and will produce Ouchess's charming opera, "La Grande Duchesse," early in April. The best talent has been engaged, and a finished production of the French composer's great work is promised.

—Mr. Frank Love was surprised at his home on Hope street the other evening by an invasion of school teachers who were introduced to that gentleman by Mr. A. C. Stewart. They brought a handsome silver tea service and made Mr. Love its possessor. Mrs. Gahan read a complimentary address to which he replied happily. Mr. Love while in the school house was a warm advocate of the teachers' rights.

—Woodstock Sentinel-Review: "It is said that a syndicate of Buffalo capitalists have in view the construction of an electric railway between London and Woodstock, to be used for the carriage of freight and passengers. The project is as yet in a somewhat indefinite shape, and from advice which have been received would seem to hinge on the granting of certain concessions by the Woodstock town council. It is said that should these be granted the project would soon take definite form, and that the work on the railway would be projected at once."

The Beginning.
Although the cycling season has barely commenced one wheel has already met a not unusual fate. Mr. H. Drewe, Dundas street east, was riding down King street on Tuesday afternoon and endeavored to pass close in front of a horse attached to a heavy wagon driven by Mr. H. C. Simpson, Dundas street. Mr. Drewe was thrown, but fell clear, while his bicycle was bent and twisted out of all shape.

Saturday's Two Performances.
An enjoyable event of the season will unquestionably be the engagement of that charming actress and beautiful woman Marie Wainwright, at the Opera House, matinee and night, Saturday, March 17. Miss Wainwright is an excellently trained and thoroughly intelligent actress, whose acquired merits delightfully supplement many most attractive gifts of nature. It is always a pleasure to see and hear her, and the more so because she invariably surrounds herself with a capital company, and presents plays of indisputable merit. At the matinee she will offer the famous English comedy of social life, "An Unusual Match," one of the best of the Haymarket series of plays. In "Man and Wife," which will be given at night, Miss Wainwright has a play which should prove a potent attraction, and one moreover that has the additional merit of being almost a novelty here. All readers of modern fiction know the splendidly exciting story of Wilkie Collins, on which the play is founded.

Number Three Committee.
No. 3 committee met last night, and on Market Clerk Wilson's recommendation it was decided to spread gravel where needed; to raise part of the Covent Garden sidewalk, and to place cross-bars on the lower windows of the market. In his report Mr. Wilson objected to Ald. Parnell saying that he (Mr. Wilson) should be made "to earn his bread by the sweat of his brow." With reference to this Ald. Parnell said that it was high time that officials were taught to earn their salaries. The committee began to discuss the specifications for electric lighting, but decided to hold a special meeting for that purpose. Chief Roe submitted his estimate for the year as follows: Salaries, \$10,850; building, \$800; fuel and gas, \$650; fire alarms, \$500; capital account, \$800; general expenditure, \$800; fodder, \$1,000; total, \$15,400. The estimate for the year is \$14,500. Tenders were then opened. Section 1 was let to Maurice Baldwin at \$387, section 2 to Josh Hartley at \$391, section 3 to George Smart at \$340. No tender was allowed more than one section and one tender was thrown out for want of a marked check. The price is \$84 more than last year. The estimated market expenditure for the year is \$1,000; estimate for lighting, \$21,000. The relief wood contract was let to Thomas S. Walls, present contractor, at \$4 per cord, all beech wood. The members present were Ald. Parnell (chairman), O'Meara, Scarrow, John Heaman, Wm. Heaman, Nutkins, Secretary Bell, Inspector Bell, Engineer Graydon and Chief Roe. The committee's estimates are \$540 more this year than last, but an item of \$500 is for the proposed market closets.

CONCISE CULLINGS.

John T. Ford, the veteran theatrical manager, died at his residence in Baltimore on Wednesday.

The United States Postmaster-General has signed a parcel post convention with Newfoundland.

Col. R. E. J. Miles, the well-known theatrical manager, died on Tuesday night at Cincinnati.

It has been estimated by several of the most important concessionaires that over \$7,000,000 was spent by the public in the attractions of the Midway.

E. R. Walters, chief clerk of Supt. Brant, of the Colorado Midland Railway, has been arrested in Denver, charged with embezzling about \$15,000.

The British army estimates for the coming fiscal year show an increase of \$278,100. This increase is due to the price of coal and forage, and the augmentation of the militia and army.

A big street car deal, involving nearly \$1,000,000 in money and eleven corporate companies, has just been consummated by Mr. A. L. Johnson, of Cleveland, whereby that gentleman obtains a monopoly of the entire street car system at Allentown, Pa.
