

Tangier, March 10 .- Through the courtesy of Sid Hadj Mohammed Ben el-Arbie Torres, minister of foreign affairs of Morocco, the correspondent with George E. Holt, American vice-consul-general to Morocco, was accorded the privilege of inspecting the larger "half" of the Moorish navy, as represented by the shereefian gunboat Es Sid e Turki, lying at anchor n Tangier Bay.
