Sugar Trust Investigators Will Go to New York to Get His Testimony.

Washington, July 15.—When the house sugar trust" investigating committee goes to New York next week to confinue its inquiry, it will send a sub-committee Its inquiry, it will send a sub-committee to the home of John Arbuckle, head of the firm of Arbuckle Brothers, if Mr. Arbuckle is unable to appear at the hearing there. He is too fil to come to Washington in response to the committee's request and probably will not be able to attend the New York hearing. Mr. Arbuckle, whose interests are competitive with those of the American Sugar Refining Company, is expected by the committee to reveal vital information concerning the operations of the "trust" and its control of the country's sugar business.
