PLAN DOUBLE USE FOR NEW SCHOOL

Pottersburg Public School Pupils Will Study at East Collegiate.

East London collegiate students and Pottersburg public school pupils will be housed in the new 20-room school approved by the board of education yesterday to be built at the corner of Dundas street and Highbury avenue. Having already granted permission for this arrangement as a temporary expediency, the provincial department of education will now be asked to place its stamp of approval on the detailed plans of the building, following which tenders will be called for immediately by the board. In wanting for the new school the city council endorsed expenditures to cover \$50,000 for a site and \$215,000 for the building, but since the board secured the site for \$25,000 from the Ontario government, the board will now have \$240,000 remaining for the construction of the building.

Trustee Wm. J. Murray boldly questioned the wisdom of the board in building such a large school, pointing out that only 17 rooms are being used by the East London collegiate and the Pottersburg school in their present locations, that a tendency to point out that his proposition would have been quite correct as to increased attendance had not legislation compelled out-of-town students to attend their nearest continuation school, while Trustee Geo. F. Copeland intimated that all the accommodation would be used by a rearrangement of the students attending the south and central units of the collegiate, and also one or more of the public schools in the eastern districts of the city.

Trustee A. R. Cairncross, vice-chairman, denounced a press story crediting Charles Mitchell, chairman of the board of health, with condemning public school drinking fountains as "showing an unfortunate lack of co-operation between public health and the city."

Trustee S. F. Lawrance, chairman, took his fling at the local news-papers, saying: "That if the press continues to print such stuff then respectable men will not come."

The board of education, the board then decided that Mr. Mitchell's assertions were not worth answering, and the question is thoroughly canvassed at a later date.

Whenver possible, only teachers holding first-class certificates are to be appointed to the public school. The board recommended that those now on the staff holding second-class certificates proceed to take the necessary examinations leading to a first-class certificate, in order that a general improvement may be effected in the qualifications of the whole staff.

The executive committee reported having arranged a conference with Dr. E. W. Fuller, chief supervisor of dentists, for the purpose of acquiring more information as to the request of the school dentists for the appointment of lady assistants. There has been some trouble in the past in this department, as the result of which it is understood the reputation of the members of the staff is being endangered by false rumors, and the intention is to inquire into the situation thoroughly.

Administrator G. A. Wheable, B.A., is investigating the matter of the operation of the proposed vocational auxiliary classes, and will report later to the executive committee.

Capt. W. H. Robinson, supervisor of caretaking and repairs, was instructed to install fire alarm gongs at all schools where found necessary.

Claims for damages suffered in accidents to pupils on school grounds or to workmen in effecting repairs at any of the schools are all to be referred to the board's solicitor in future, before being submitted to the board.

Administrator Wheable was given power to transfer pupils from crowded schools to less congested schools in continuous districts, while future changes in boundaries of school districts were left to the discretion of the administrator and the executive committee.

John Petherborough's tender of \$200 for the wrecking and removal of the house on the board's property at 144 King street was accepted, as was J. Willis' tender of \$1,001 for the wrecking and removal of the bursar's residence on the property purchased for the new school in East London.

Permission was granted the Benson-Wilcox Electric Company to install an oil-o-matic heater in Victoria public school for demonstration purposes under a full guarantee to the board.
