FIRE LOSSES IN RESTIGOUCHE
The fire losses in Restigouche County from Jan. 1st last to June 30th, amounted to \$53,182. In all there were 34 fires, divided as follows: Country districts 12 entailing a loss of \$13,032, upon which there was \$10,000 insurance carried. There were 18 fires in Campbellton entailing a loss of \$35,355, which was covered by \$33,194 insurance. Dalhousie had four fires entailing a loss of \$3,895 upon which \$1,895 insurance was carried.

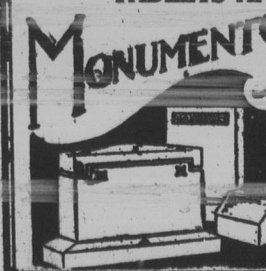
