

## IMPORTATION OF BUTTER.

Some Misstatements of the Globe Exposed.  
In the House of Commons.  
OTTAWA, May 2.—Mr. Taylor, in moving for a return showing the number of pounds of butter imported from the United States into Canada for the years 1884, 1885, 1886 and up to April 1, 1887, took up the figures quoted by the Globe of the other day and dealt with them lengthily. The facts of the case are, in substance, as follows:

The Globe inserted in a pretty middle the other day when discussing editorially the question of the importation of butter from the United States. It said:  
The following figures from the trade and organization returns show what the change (in quantity) of imports have been:

Why upon earth should one state pounds of American butter as being imported from the United States, and then go on to prove to its own satisfaction that the alleged butter must be of European origin, and not of American origin? It would be better, unless to charge the Globe with wilfully falsifying the figures in order to pose as the dairymen's friend, but what has been done is, whether intentionally or only stupidity, is that the Globe publishes the values of the imported butter, but not the quantity of butter consumed. Put "value instead of 'butter consumption' and the figures are correct. The amounts entered for butter consumption in the years named were: 1884, 15,315,000 pounds; 1885, 15,315,000 pounds; 1886, 15,315,000 pounds; 1887, 15,315,000 pounds. The amounts entered for butter, and possibly oligomerized, thrown into Quebec from the Eastern States, where the numerous butter bills were before Parliament last session.

A study of the butter figures, when not misstated by the Globe, shows that the quantity of American butter, which is the total quantity of butter entered for consumption in the Dominion during the past four and a half years, is not more than one-half of the quantity of butter imported from Ontario and Manitoba.
