

BROOKE COUNCIL

Inwood, Feb. 18th, 1922
Council met pursuant to adjournment on above date. Members all present. Minutes of former meeting read and on motion of Sutton-Loosemore, were adopted.

In the absence of the Clerk through illness, Mr. Walter Annett was appointed clerk pro tem.

Communications received and read as follows:—R. C. R. McKenzie in behalf of Orville Lloyd owner of w 1/2, lot 1, Con. 6 and David Lloyd owner of e 1/2, lot 1, con. 6, re damage to lands by reason of the water from the Weidman Drain not being sufficiently taken away by the Black Creek outlet.

Sutton-Loosemore, that this matter be referred to Solicitor.—Car.

From the Children's Aid Society, Sarnia, asking for a grant in aid of the Society.

Sutton-Loosemore, that the sum of \$10.00 be granted.—Carried.

Lambton County Corn Growers' Association asked for a grant of \$38.05 being the amount awarded in prizes to Brooke Township.

Campbell-McLean, that the amount be granted.—Carried.

Tender for Township printing for 1922 received from Alvinston Free Press. Laid over till next meeting of Council on motion of Sutton and Campbell.

Mr. Alfred Wilkes notified the Council to have the Cran drain repaired. Sutton-McLean, that the repairing of the Cran drain be left to Commissioner of the Division.—Carried.

Mr. Edward Totten served notice in writing to have the 6-7 Sideroad drain repaired and also the Stewart drain in the 8th con. be repaired across lot 7.

Loosemore-Sutton, that notice be entertained and Geo. A. McCubbin O.L.S.&C.E., be instructed to make an examination of the drains and submit a report, plan, profile and estimate and to make an assessment of lands and roads liable for assessment under the provisions of The Municipal Drainage Act.—Carried.

Brooke Telephone System asked that \$600 be advanced for Telephone purposes. Granted on motion of Sutton—Campbell.

The Advisory Board of the Brooke Municipal Telephone System asked that Brooke Council pass a bylaw giving the Board power to collect pay for cutting of telephone wires, etc., from parties moving buildings on the roads of the municipality.—Referred to solicitor.

A. E. Loosemore served notice in writing to have the Loosemore Drain repaired.

Campbell-McLean, that motion be entertained and A. S. Code, O.L.S.&C.E., be instructed to make the examination of the drain and report.—Carried.

Sutton-Loosemore, that Council adjourn to meet in Alvinston on March 11th, 1922.—Carried.



Muma-Dann, that in reference to closing the blind line between mine and six sideroad the council take no action in the matter.—Carried.

Dann-Campbell, that this Council take no action in the claim of Fred Cundjek for repair to auto.—Carried.

Bylaw No. 4 on the Kingston drain was read the first and second times and provisionally adopted.

Bylaw No. 5 on the Lester drain was read the first and second times and provisionally adopted.

The Council then adjourned to meet on Monday, the 27th day of March, at the hour of one o'clock, p.m., as a court of revision on the Kingston drain and the Lester drain and for general business.
