Whence Came the Corn Borer

Experts who have examined the situation estimate that the farmers of Western Ontario, as the direct result of the operations of the corn borer, will this year suffer a loss of not less than \$1,230,000. This is stated to be a conservative estimate, based on ten per cent. of the value of the crop, and the loss is placed at a considerably higher figure by other authorities that have investigated the damage. The insect reached the province only fourteen or fifteen years ago, having been introduced so far as can be determined, into Elgin County on broom corn brought from Austria about 1909 or 1910. From the few borers that then arrived have come in this brief interval many billions, already spread over almost all the province.

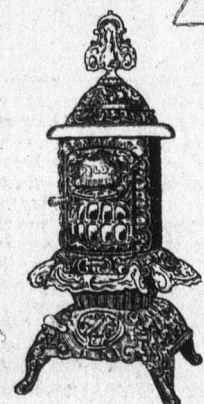

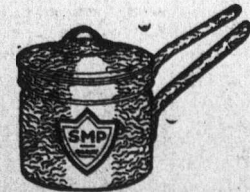
