this is not all. He has created a wost wonderful Muscial Instrument for the use of every one. Between the top of the throat and the root of the tongue, he has made an enlarge-ment—a cavity of two or three inches, and most curiously lined it with delicate membranes, so stretched that the air passing through them makes a sound as through a clarionet. This would be a curious instrument even if it admitted of no variation of sound; but it is furnished with fine cartileges which contract and expand the cavity at pleasure, in different ways, so as to give different vibrations, and of course different tones. In this small space, then, in the throat of every human being, is an instrument with a compass of from two to three octaves, which has the command of every semi tone and subdivision of note, swell, trill, etc and not necessarily exposed to the imperfections of artificial instruments, but so clear, so rich so sweet as to be the highest standard of comparison, in these points, for the flute, clarionet, piano and organ.
