Would a little girl of eleven be elegible for membership in a Senier Branch of the W.A., when there is no Junior Branch in the parish? Certainly. The constitution sets no age limit to membership, and the division of workers into Senior, Girls' and Junior Branches, is merely done to make the work more systematic, and because, as a rule, the Girls and the Juniors prefer to work with companions of their own ages.

From what fund are the Diocesan working expenses of the W A. paid? There is no general rule for the whole Auxiliary. In the Diocese of Toronto all expenses are paid from the members' fees, to cts. being paid by each member to the Diocesan Board, annually This provides all the money required for expenses, and the balance is voted by the Executive to making up the Pledges when necessary, or to other Mission Funds.
