would not be very much. But, seriously, a minister of the Gospel should be treated fairly, and an opportunity given him to devote his whole energy to the work without the constant pressure of daily and corroding care. This the struggle for existence renders all but impossible.

The church wants funds for other purposes, and whilst money is not a substitute for spiritual power, and never can be, yet it is, in its own place, one of the agencies necessary for the due carrying on of the work of the Church.
