We cannot but regret to find that relations and friends of the indigent sick Emigrants who have arrived in this Port during the present season, still persevere in the reprehensible practice of abstaining from sending their sick to the Hospital, and that on the contrary they are permitted to employ themselves in hard labour while suffering from sikness, whereby upon their entering the Hospital, they are found in many instances to have been rendered incurable; and we feel it our many to represent this circumstance as having (more especially in the present sickly season of the year) greatly enlarged the list of mortality.
