SOME NEW BOOKS.

- Ford, Mary Hanford.** "The Legends of Parsifal." New York: H. M. Caldwell & Co. A concise and careful account of Wagner's version of Parsifal, and the comparison of the other accounts of the same legend. Beautifully presented in a handsome little volume, bearing on its cover a reproduction of the Holy Grail. The writer writes with a thorough knowledge of her subject. The book is invaluable to all students and lovers of Parsifal.
- Hewlett, Maurice.** "Queen's Quair." Toronto: Morang & Co. A most remarkable tale, written with the object of elucidating the bewildering mystery which has at all times enshrouded the beautiful figure of Mary, Queen of Scots. The action covers the six-year period from the Queen's departure from France until her imprisonment. Mr. Hewlett has succeeded in drawing a vivid picture of the ill-fated Mary and the men who surrounded her, and has made of his book a strangely impressive creation.
- McCurdy, Edward.** "Leonardo da Vinci." London: George Bell & Sons, 5s net. The latest addition to the "Great Masters in Painting and Sculpture" series, and a worthy successor to a long list of useful

text books on art. The illustrations are all reproductions of da Vinci's work, and are admirably presented. The book is well printed, and should form a salable adjunct to any bookseller's stock.

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- Phillips, David Graham.** "The Cost." Toronto: McLeod & Allen. Price, \$1.25. A typical story of modern American life, introducing life at a western college and later, politics and business. The heroine, Pauline Gardiner, confuses her ideal in two men, and marries the wrong one. The rest of the book deals with how she discovered her mistake, and how she suffered for it. There are some strong scenes in the book, notably the convention scene and the final triumph of the dying John Dumont in the stock mart.
- Sedgwick, Henry D.** "Francis Parkman." American Men of Letters Series. Boston: Houghton, Mifflin & Co. \$1.10 net. The life of the eminent American historian, who has done so much to illuminate the early history of Canada, is admirably summed up in this compact volume. Special attention is bestowed on his earlier years, and the holiday journeys of his youth, a part of his life to which his diaries give free access. The biographer writes sympathetically of his later years and the sufferings he endured.
- "Strenuous Epigrams of Theodore Roosevelt." New York: H. M. Caldwell & Co. A dainty little booklet containing a collection of short, pithy epigrams, evidently taken from speeches delivered by the President. As an introduction, a short sketch of Roosevelt's life is inserted.
- Weymouth, Richard Francis.** "The New Testament in Modern Speech." 674 pages. London: James Clarke & Co. Cloth, 2s 6d. Blue leather, 5s. An idiomatic translation into everyday English from the text of the *Resultant Greek Testament*. Warmly endorsed by the British and Foreign Bible Society and by numerous divines.
- Wing, Rev. Russell.** "Some of Life's Gleanings." London: Chas. J. Thynne, 2s cloth. Containing the thoughts of gifted writers on a large number and variety of subjects. These have been gleaned from the manuscript books of the late Rev. Russell Wing, where they had been transcribed from a vast number of sources. By means of an index and a careful arrangement of topics, the reader has at his command an excellent storehouse of material.
- Wood, William.** "The Fight for Canada." London: Archibald Constable & Co. Price, one guinea net. A new and complete account of the campaign, which culminated in Wolfe's capture of Quebec, compiled from the official documents. This is the first authentic history of the war of conquest, combining the military and naval manoeuvres in a limited whole. Hitherto historians have built on theories and fancies and have neglected the actual side of the campaign. Major Wood has had access to all the original documents, and has produced a most valuable work.
