


(a) Having entered upon the 7. P-Q 3 defence, he should have gone on with the normal continution, 8. B-K 2; 9. B-K 2, B x P (+); 10. P-K Kt 3, B-Kt 4; 11. Castles, etc. There is no time to spare as yet for the development on the Q's wing.
