DOUBLE-TRACKING OF YONGE ST. BEFORE BOARD

Chairman Leitch Says Only Question of Law—Big Event Out In King Township.

NORTH TORONTO, Oct. 6.—(Special.)—The meeting of the Ontario Railway Board, which took place in the city this morning, to hear the complaint preferred by Herbert Waddington and Mr. Winter, with respect to overcrowding on the Metropolitan, and the subsequent declaration of Chairman Leitch that they were fully convinced of the necessity of double-tracking Yonge-street, has given rise to the greatest adverse criticism here. Mayor Brown, Solicitor Gibson and a majority of the council board do not hesitate to express their disapproval of the conclusion arrived at by the chairman of the board, after a few only of the witnesses had been heard, and these largely Toronto men and members of the North Toronto Golf Club.

"A ridiculous proposition," said his worship, Mayor Brown, "and I can tell you I don't think very much of it. Do they think they can saddle the enormous cost of improving Yonge-street in order to make it a highway for the haulage of freight cars and every other conceivable kind of cars through here, to benefit the Metropolitan Railway? I don't think so. We will, of course, follow the thing right thru to the end."

Solicitor Gibson was equally non-plussed at the turn of events. He will not admit the right of the railway board to order the double-tracking, and will oppose the application of Mr. Waddington and Mr. Winter at every turn. "I believe that the Townships of York, Markham, Vaughan, King and the municipalities thru which the Metropolitan Railway passes ought to be asked to support the objection of the town and city," said a North Toronto man. "Is Yonge-street going to be the great railway line for the bringing down of freight cars? The Metropolitan Railway will try the same high-handed methods further on the line that they are trying here before long. Yonge-street property will be enormously damaged. The Ontario Railway Board, nor any other board, will ever attempt to make us run double tracks. They have not the right to do so."

Before the commission the first witness called was Herbert Waddington, who, examined by his lawyer, Gibson, declared that the extra switches would not relieve the congestion, but a double track would. Much time was lost thru haggling between railway employees as to the right of way.

"What is your conclusion?" said Mr. Grant.

There are not enough cars for the evening and other rush hours, and you cannot operate more cars until you get a double track.

Traffic Manager Wilson stated that more trailers could not be used, owing to the grade between the C. P. R. crossing and Glen Grove, which was eight per cent.

R. B. Beaumont of the Rosedale Golf Club declared that 250 members of the club were anxious for better accommodation, and said that a switch to be effective would require to reach half way from Glen Grove to the golf club.

Registrar Holmsted of Osgoode Hall also took exception to the stiff conditions of the case.

Beverly Jones, R. H. Green and other members of the golf club gave evidence, and further testimony was on the point of being submitted when Chairman Leitch interrupted when the committee were already convinced of the necessity for a double track.

"The only way to deal with the situation," he said, "is by a double-track from the C. P. R. crossing thru Glen Grove to the golf grounds. The only question is to whether we have power to order it or not. Our only difficulty is that. But if we have the power, that's going to be double-tracked—that line. Of course, you'll have to fill in your great big wide ditches in Yonge-street. If you do you'll have room for the two tracks. The only question is whether we have the power to give the people the relief they need."

There is no doubt in our minds as to the condition. We have seen it ourselves. Our engineers have seen it and we have been inundated with complaints.

City Solicitor Johnston wanted to know if evidence to the contrary could be submitted. "We object to having a double-track order issued. It is

Later refreshments were served and a social time was spent by all. So widespread was interest in the celebration, that large as was the attendance, it was estimated that under normal weather conditions from 1000 to 2000 people would have been present.

Dr. Carmichael has received many calls to other churches, but remained true to his first love. He was several years lecturer in church history in Queen's University. Active and alert, he bids fair to see many years more of public service.

QUEEN-MOTHER BLAMED TREATED MANUEL AS CHILD

Openly Scolded Him One Day For Breaking a Window—Adhesion to Clericals Cause of Trouble.

NEW YORK, Oct. 6.—Dr. Maurice Baumfeld of Berlin, correspondent of The Berliner Tageblatt, who returned to New York Saturday after several weeks' sojourn in Lisbon, gives interesting details of the revolution in Portugal which came under his observation when travelling thru that country last month. He came in personal contact with many men who are prominent figures in the revolution.

The revolution, according to Dr. Baumfeld, was precipitated by the queen mother's adhesion with the clerical party, led by Jacinto Candido, a member of parliament and in high favor with the queen. It was asserted soon after King Manuel announced his liberal policy that the clerical party was fostering a plan to dethrone the king because of his liberal tendencies, and to install the clerical party, without, however, according to the plan to raise Dr. Braganza to the throne.

"The queen treated the king like a child," said Dr. Baumfeld. "One afternoon they had returned to the palace from an automobile ride. King Manuel broke a window, and although a score of notables were present the queen mother scolded him amazingly for his petulant fault. The news was soon broadcast and caused much public discussion in the wine shops and other places where the populace gathers at night."

Two Kinds of Rebels. "In one of these shops I saw a man break a bottle of wine, pointing to the liquid as it ran over the floor, he shouted, 'As this wine flows so will blood flow in the streets of Lisbon with in a few days! The monarchy is doomed!'"

There are two wings of the revolutionary party, said Dr. Baumfeld. The so-called, or intellectual branch, here more powerful, is led by Dr. Theophile Braga, now president of the provisional government, the other, the radical branch, being led by Dr. Alfonso Costa, a former member of the parliament.

Dr. Costa has many followers, drawn principally from the lower classes, nearly all of them illiterate and strongly in sympathy with the doctrines of force and violence. The opinion prevails among the better class in Portugal that Dr. Costa's predominance in public affairs will prove calamitous, and he will be resisted.

Opposed to these parties are the progressives, or monarchists, headed under the leadership of Jose Luciano de Castro, who was the intimate adviser of King Manuel and prominent in public affairs for many years. Another branch of this party is reconstruction party, which was led until Monday by Antonio Teixeira de Sousa, prime minister in King Manuel's cabinet.

According to Dr. Baumfeld, there are about 17 political parties in Portugal, some of which must necessarily be extinguished if the plans of the republicans now in control do not miscarry.

Hope in Marriage.

The only hope of the monarchists was the marriage of the king, said Dr. Baumfeld. "They sought to bring about an alliance with the Princess of Battemberg, and when that project failed they directed a report that King Manuel was to wed the daughter of Archduke Frederick of Austria."
